Lesson Plan

Major/Minor 2nds and the Chromatic/Whole Tone Scales

Objective:

Students will be able recognize Major and Minor 2nds, aurally and visually.

Students will be able to recognize the Chromatic Scale and the Whole Tone Scale aurally and visually.

Students will be able to sing isolated Major and Minor 2nds.

Students will be able to sing the Chromatic Scale and the Whole Tone Scale.

Pre-requisite:

Note Values, Note Names, Treble Clef, Sharps and Flats

Procedure

Lecture on the minor 2^{nd} as the smallest stepwise interval in music, the ½ step, and the major 2^{nd} as a whole step. The teacher will play the minor 2^{nd} on the piano followed by major 2^{nd} . Students will then visualize these intervals using photograph of a keyboard.

Class will then practice singing the requested major/minor 2nd intervals both ascending and descending. Students will then refer to the Intervallic Ear Training worksheet on major/minor seconds and sing through requested lines in groups of 3's. There will be examples of ascending major and minor 2nds, as well as descending.

Students will then practice identifying and constructing major and minor seconds. Settings provided by teacher, and at

Teacher will lecture and demonstrate the Chromatic Scale on the piano. (Scale built on ½ steps or minor 2nds) Students will sing through the chromatic scale on la, ascending and descending, followed by solfege. Use:

Teacher will lecture and demonstrate the Whole Tone Scale on the piano. (Scale built on whole steps.) Students will sing through the Whole Tone Scale ascending and descending on Ia, and using solfege.

Teacher will share contextual listening examples of both the Chromatic Scale and the Whole Tone Scale.
